Goals and Objectives

By the year 2010, 80% of East Region students in grades three through eleven, within all subgroups, will be proficient in English Language Arts (ELA) & Mathematics as measured by the Nevada Criterion Reference Tests or the Nevada High School Proficiency Exams.
East Region students will increase proficiency in ELA by 13% as measured by the 2007 CRT. The focus will be on the content strands of Read to Comprehend, Interpret, & Evaluate Literature & Informational Text at the cognitive ability level of Demonstrating a Critical Stance.
East Region students will increase proficiency in Mathematics by 9.5% as measured by the 2007 CRT. The focus will be on the content strands of Measurement & Geometry & Data Analysis – Statistics & Probability at the cognitive ability level of Problem Solving.
By the Year 2010, 80% of all East Region high school students will graduate from High School.
Increase graduation rate from 53.89% to 60.5%.
Parent, family, & community engagement in the improvement of student achievement will increase in all schools. All East region schools will have active Parents As Academic Leaders (PAALS) groups to increase parent & community understanding & support for achievement initiatives outlined in each School Improvement Plan.
East Region Schools will show increased parent and community participation in academic functions such as Parent/Teacher conferences, curriculum fairs, Literacy Nights & parent training for assisting students with academics.

Communication Efforts

The East Region regularly encourages & promotes meaningful communication with parents, families, & the community through the Region Superintendent's Parents as Academic Leaders (PAALs). Monthly meetings of this group address strategies for increasing parent engagement in learning. Parents learned about AYP & how it affects their child's school. PAALs meetings held by East Region Specialists gave parents strategies on how to assist children with academics. Field trips to UNLV & Nevada State College gave parents information about college opportunities. A conference in April provided a multitude of workshops for parents to learn how to assist their children at all levels with learning at home. Each school displays an up-to-date Parent Communication Handbook so parents can access information on such items as attendance, transportation, discipline, safety, budget, accountability, health services, curriculum, grading, attendance zones, & parent involvement. Schools publish four newsletters each year & conduct individual parent-teacher conferences on a regular schedule for grades K-5 & for grades 6-12 as needed. Surveys are regularly conducted to obtain feedback from parents.

Public Meetings

The East Region held 15 public meetings during the 2006 - 2007 school year. The Parents As Academic Leaders (PAALs) met monthly in both the morning and evening. Parent leaders were provided with strategies to help improve student achievement through increased parent and family engagement. The Superintendent's Business Advisory Council met with three objectives: involve community leaders to increase understanding of the region goals; apply best practices of the business world to school improvement; and build support for community schools. In addition, School Board Trustee Sheila Moulton held monthly Parent Advisory Committee meetings at the region office.
